The 2013 Côtes du Roussillon Villages Les Orris is another terrific vintage of this cuvee. Made from 50% Syrah, 35% Mourvèdre and 15% Grenache that spent 12 months in 50% new oak barrels. Backwards, structured and in need of cellaring, it offers subtle plum and blackberry fruits, licorice, roasted herbs and mineral characteristic to go with full-bodied richness, building tannin and a big finish. Give it 2-3 years and enjoy bottle through 2025. There were 6,000 bottles produced, and it's worth the effort to track down.

While I love the dry reds from this estate, I wasn't impressed with either of their Rivesaltes releases.
