Moving to the dry table wines, the 2013 Côtes du Roussillon Les Orris Blanc is a stunner. Made from equal parts Roussanne and Grenache Blanc that spent a year in 50% new oak, it has gorgeous notes of dried pineapple, brioche, white flowers and some exotic herbs. These flow to a medium to full-bodied, ripe, texture and classy white that has nicely integrated oak, good acidity and a terrific finish. I'd enjoy bottles over the coming couple of years, but it will evolve for longer.

While I love the dry reds from this estate, I wasn't impressed with either of their Rivesaltes releases.
