Regis Boucabeille Les Terrasses 2012

Cotes du Roussillon Villages, France
\$11

This organic blend of grenache, syrah and carignan shows southern France at its finest: a value-priced red wine that tastes like it came from somewhere. In this case, somewhere is the Mediterranean coast of France, but not the glittery beaches of Provence; rather the wild, rough-and-tumble coast closer to Spain.

Paul Direder is only 23, but for the past few years he has produced this consistently good example of Austria's signature white wine. It is crisp, citrusy and refreshing, and with the liter-size bottle (a third more than the standard 750 ml), a terrific value.
